Principal's Message

Fall is here and the school year is well underway with students actively engaged in their learning throughout the school! Aside from their academics, students have also been involved in several recess and lunchtime activities including kilometre club, choir, concert band, equity allies, eco-club, volleyball, library and helping in the office. We are continuing with our monthly assemblies focused on building our knowledge of the Character Traits. In the month of October, we focused on Responsibility and in November, we will build our knowledge base around Empathy. In November, we are also looking forward to our first Houses meeting of this school year. Ask your child if they are in the Bear, Deer, Buffalo or Eagle house! Thank you to all of the staff members who have supported the students in these extra-curricular activities.

As always, we appreciate the important role that you play in supporting student learning at home. I encourage you to attend the upcoming parent/teacher interviews to further discuss ways in which we can work together to advance the learning skills, work habits and academic progress of our students. Progress cards and initial observations will be sent home on Wednesday, November 13th and interviews will take place on

Thursday, November 14th in the evening and on Friday, November 15th in the morning. Please be reminded that there is no school for the students on November 15th.

Safety during student pick-up and drop-off remains a priority for all of us at EB Phin. We are encouraging all of the students that are waiting to be picked up to stand by the front, main doors as to prevent the traffic from backing up out onto Rougemount and Altona. As well, cars should only be parking or stopping for long periods of time in the lane closest to the school. We understand that our loop is not ideal for the number of cars that are currently using it and need everyone to work together to keep things moving and keep all of our students safe. Lastly, please be reminded that the parking lot area is only for staff parking, volunteers and our buses. The parking lot area is not to be used for either student drop-off or pick-up. It is extremely important that all children learn the value and importance of being punctual and attending classes regularly. As these are lifelong skills, we would ask that you assist and support us in reinforcing their importance with the students. Teachers take attendance immediately following entry and the attendance is sent to the office. Whenever a child is marked absent, and the school is unaware of the reason, the office staff will attempt to contact a parent/guardian at home or at work to determine the child's whereabouts and ensure that no harm has come to him or her on the way to school. If your child is late, please have them report to the office for a late slip. Office detentions will be issued to students who are habitually late. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

SCHOOLMESSENGER® offers parents/guardians the ability to report student absences to their child's school via phone, internet or mobile app as well as receive notifications for both attendance and non-attendance related purposes.

Your SchoolMessenger® Account can be set up in 3 ways:

- 2. Download the SchoolMessenger app from the Google Play Store
- 3. Download the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store

Instructions:

- 1. Sign Up for an account on the website (go.schoolmessenger.ca).
- 2. Use the same email address that the school has on record for you.
 - **TIP:** If you are not sure which email address we have on file for you, please login to the Parent Portal and view your contact information on the Parent Contact Information tab.
- 3. **Create your password;** for security reasons, passwords must contain at least one number, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and must be at least 6 characters.
- 4. Verify your account by following the instructions in the email that is sent to you.

This login information is for parents to report student absences and should not be shared with your child. Please ensure that your login information is protected.

Reporting Absences Online or through the SchoolMessenger® App

Login to the app or website using your email address and the password that **you created in the Sign Up step above**. If your email address is associated with at least one child in a school that is actively using SafeArrival, you will see the **ATTENDANCE** option on the menu. This is shown at the top of the screen on the website or in the top left corner of the mobile apps.

5 Good Study Habits

(and How IXL Can Help)

Now that the back-to-school rush is subsiding, is your child starting to settle into the school year? The months ahead are full of possibilities, making this a great time to establish good study habits. We've collected 5 tips to help your child succeed and included ways IXL can help you accomplish each one.

1. Refresh knowledge when needed

The start of the school year can be full of new information and fast-paced learning. If your child forgot certain math concepts over the summer or is feeling iffy about new literary terms, take time for a quick review. A low-pressure refresher can make all the difference for their confidence!

How IXL can help: Use the search bar at the top of IXL.com to find topics for review. If any skill is a little too tricky, try a lower grade level to keep building that foundation of knowledge. You can also take advantage of the skills on the Recommendations wall, which have been specifically chosen to help your child grow.

2. Understand the teacher's expectations

One sure-fire way for your child to succeed is to understand their teacher's expectations. This includes everything from how assignments are evaluated to what SmartScore they should reach. If anything isn't clear, you or your child should feel comfortable following up with the teacher. Communication is key!

How IXL can help: Referring to IXL Analytics can be helpful when discussing goals and expectations with a teacher. IXL's reports can show you how much time your child spent on IXL, which questions were challenging, and more. IXL Analytics can also help reveal your child's progress and start a good conversation about appropriate SmartScore goals.

3. Study a little every day

Just like cramming the night before a quiz doesn't work out in the long run, trying to master a concept all at once can be daunting for any student. Encourage your child to prioritize short-but-sweet studying whenever possible; in other words, consistent, high-quality learning beats one or two high-stress sessions!

How IXL can help: Even brief IXL work makes a big difference! Our research shows that schools where students answer at least 15 questions per week outperform all the others. If your child only has time for a little IXL, it will still be valuable. And remember: IXL progress is automatically saved, so taking breaks is always okay.

4. Be an active reader

Skimming instructions, readings, and other school assignments can be tempting for any student, especially once the school year is in full swing and the workload keeps coming. Your child can practice active reading by doing things like noting the main idea of a passage, summarizing instructions in their own words, and taking time to look up unfamiliar words or concepts. This will help solidify what they're learning so it really sticks!

How IXL can help: When your child gets an IXL question wrong, do they take time to read the answer explanation? Doing so will help them understand the concept better and learn from their mistakes—and it can also be a way for them to get in the habit of active reading. It may even be helpful to read the explanation aloud, or to a partner or parent. Then they can click "Got it" with confidence.

5. Celebrate success and look to the future

Sometimes students can become so focused on work that they don't take time to celebrate small victories. Acknowledging these moments will motivate them to keep up the effort and may even inspire them to create new goals. The next accomplishment is just around the corner!

How IXL can help: Through their work on IXL, students earn certificates and awards that acknowledge what they've achieved. Both are great ways to highlight their hard work—you can even display certificates in a place of prominence! You can also encourage your child to use the awards as goal inspiration for time spent, questions answered, and more.






November 11 - Remembrance Day (Canadian)
